<u>UNIT I:</u> <u>INTRODUCTION TO LITERARY RESEARCH</u>

Planning Research. Identifying a topic: formulating a research question; moving from research question to working thesis: determining research design.

Conducting Research. Primary and Secondary sources. Library research: subject-word search; keyword search; catalogue information on books; book indexes; periodical indexes; specialized indexes and abstracts.

Presenting Research: Using the logical patterns of text organization; inductive method; deductive method; cause-effect method; chronological method; problem-solution method.

<u>UNIT II:</u> <u>USING THE INTERNET IN LITERARY RESEARCH</u>

Searching the World Wide Web: E-Libraries; Internet subject directories; search engines; keyword search; discipline-specific online databases; references and indexes available online or on CD-ROM.

Evaluating Online Information: Credibility; author; publisher; sponsor; domain type; Accuracy; timeliness, copyright information.

Author-based Approaches: Biographical approach; Expressive Realism

Reader-based Approaches: Reader-Response Theory

Context-based Approaches: Marxist Criticism; New Historicism; Feminist Criticism;

Postcolonial Criticism.

Text-based Approaches: Russian Formalism; New Criticism; Structuralism; Deconstruction.
