REPORT ON WINTER SCHOOL 2026

The **Winter School 2026** was successfully organized by the **Centre for Career Guidance & Development (CCG&D)** with the aim of enhancing students' employability skills and preparing them for academic, professional, and competitive challenges. The program was conducted from **18 December 2025 to 5 January 2026** on the university campus and was offered **free of cost** to students from all academic disciplines. The initiative reflected CCG&D's continued commitment to skill-based education and holistic student development.

The **primary objective** of Winter School 2026 was to strengthen students **English communication skills, professional grooming, and aptitude and reasoning abilities**, which are essential for success in interviews, campus placements, and competitive examinations. The program was designed to bridge the gap between classroom learning and real-world requirements by focusing on practical application, confidence building, and industry-relevant skills. Winter School 2026 witnessed enthusiastic participation from students across disciplines. **Twenty-six (26) students successfully completed the English Speaking & Grooming Program**, while **thirty-two (32) students completed the Aptitude & Reasoning Program**, reflecting strong engagement and commitment to skill development.

The Winter School comprised two major components: **English Speaking & Grooming** and **Aptitude & Reasoning**.

The **English Speaking & Grooming module** focused on improving students fluency, vocabulary, grammar accuracy, and pronunciation, along with guidance on professional appearance, CV preparation, interview etiquette, and group discussion skills.

The **Aptitude & Reasoning module** aimed at strengthening logical thinking, problem-solving ability, mathematical aptitude, and time-management skills through shortcuts, techniques, and practice-based learning.

Each course involved a minimum of **20 hours** of structured training, and students were required to maintain at least **75% attendance** to qualify for certification.

Winter School 2026 commenced with an **Orientation Programme**, during which students were welcomed and introduced to the objectives, structure, and expected outcomes of the initiative. The orientation provided students with clarity about the importance of skill development and motivated them to actively engage in the learning process. The leadership and guidance of **Dr.**

Zishan Raza (Director In charge-CCG&D) and Mr. Abijeet Singh (Assistant Director-CCG&D), played a significant role in the smooth execution and overall success of the program.

The program was delivered by a team of experienced and dedicated **trainers**, including **Ms. Shahana Khan, Dr. Sufia Rehman, Mr. Ayaz Mehmood, and Mr. Shaz Alam**, who adopted an interactive and learner-centric teaching methodology. The training sessions included **classroom instruction, speaking activities, mock interviews, aptitude exercises, and real-life problem-solving tasks**. This approach ensured active student participation and effective skill development throughout the program.

The program concluded with a **Certificate Distribution Ceremony**, marking the successful completion of Winter School 2026. Certificates were awarded to students who fulfilled the attendance and participation criteria, recognizing their dedication, discipline, and commitment to self-improvement. The occasion also served to acknowledge the efforts of the trainers and organizers, and students were encouraged to continue applying the skills gained during the program in their academic pursuits, professional endeavors, and personal growth.

Overall, Winter School 2026 proved to be a meaningful and impactful initiative that contributed significantly to enhancing students confidence, communication abilities, and career readiness. The positive response and active participation of students highlighted the relevance and effectiveness of such skill-development programs.
