Brief report on Kisan Pathshala organized by

Department of Agriculture ,IIAST

Kisan Pathshala also popularly known as Million Farmers School, is an extension programme initiated by the government of UP in 2017 with a view to encouraging the use of modern farming techniques, to make farming more profitable, sustainable, and resilient. Unlike traditional extension services, Kisan Pathshala integrates various facets of Agricultural knowledge into a packaged format and delivers it through village-level training and dissemination of knowledge to the farmers. Keeping the above objective in mind, a Kisan Pathshala was organized by the Department of Agriculture, Integral Institute of Agricultural Science & Technology (IIAST) on 1st Oct 2022 to sensitize the natives of the Village Achramau of Tehsil Bakshi ka Talab

The Programme was observed under the guidance of Prof. (Dr.) Mohd Haris Siddiqui, Dean, Faculty of Agricultural Science and Technology and Dr. Saba Siddiqui, Head, Department of Agriculture, IIAST. The faculty coordinators Dr. Sunil Kumar, Dr. Mustfa Hussain and Ms. Akanksha Singh along with supporting staff, Syed Faisal Kirmani and Suraj Awasthi accompanied the experts and students of B.Sc (Hons.) Abu Nayyer, Assistant Professor, IIAST addressed on the topic, Value addition of vegetable crops and explained about easy storage, processing and marketing of value-added products. Mr. Anupam Singh and Mr.Ahmad Shahnewaz gave interesting and valuable information to farmers regarding new techniques of IPM and value addition in fruit crops. The interaction and communication approach of experts of Kisan Pathshala was impressive with natives of villages who were inquisitive and flooded the session with queries.
