

# **SYLLABUS & ORDINANCE FOR**

## **POST BASIC B.SC. NURSING**

### **1. Nomenclature of Course:-**

Post Basic B.Sc. Nursing  
Total Seat – 30

### **2. Aims of the course:-**

The aim of the undergraduate nursing programme is to:

- 2.1 Prepare graduates to assume responsibilities as professional, competent nurses and midwives in providing preventive, promotive, curative & rehabilitative services.
- 2.2 Prepare nurses who can make independent decisions in nursing situations, protect the rights of patient and facilitate individuals and groups in pursuit of health, function in the hospital, community nursing services and conduct research studies in the areas of nursing practices. They are also expected to assume the role of teacher, supervisor and manager in a clinical / public health setting.

### **3. Objective of course:-**

- 3.1 To prepare a professional & technically skilled nurse competent to give comprehensive nursing care to the individual, family & community in sickness & health.
- 3.2 To provide opportunities and experiences, which would enable the student to develop and maintain effective interpersonal relationship with professional & non professional personnel.
- 3.3 Develop a team spirit by working with other members of health care team in the promotion of health & prevention of illness restoration of health.
- 3.4 To ensure opportunities for initiation & resourcefulness, sense of responsibility for one self.

### **4. Eligibility Criteria:-**

- 4.1 Passed the higher Secondary or Senior Secondary or Intermediate or 10+2 or an equivalent examination recognized by the university for this purpose. Those who have done 10+1 in or before 1986 will be eligible for admission.
- 4.2 Obtain the certificate in General Nursing & Midwifery and registered as R.N.R.M. with the State Nurse Registration Council. A male Nurse, trained before the implementation of the new integrated course besides being registered as a nurse with State Nurse Registration Council, shall produce evidence of training approved by Indian Nursing Council for a similar duration in lieu of midwifery in any one of the following areas:
  - O.T. Technician

- Ophthalmic Nursing
- Leprosy Nursing
- TB Nursing
- Psychiatric Nursing
- Neurological and Neuro Surgical Nursing
- Community Health Nursing
- Cancer Nursing
- Orthopedic Nursing

4.3 Candidates shall be medically fit

4.4 Candidate shall be admitted once in a year

**5. Programme Duration:**

5.1 The duration of the programme leading to award to Post Basic B.Sc. Nursing shall be of two academic years (1<sup>st</sup> October to 30<sup>th</sup> September).

**6. Annual Intake:**

6.1 The number of students shall be admitted as approved by the executive council of the University subject to maximum seat sanctioned by the Nursing Council of India.

6.2 Admission to programme shall be made only in 1<sup>st</sup> year & last date of admission shall be 31<sup>st</sup> October of admission year.

**7. Medium of Instruction:**

The medium of instruction for all subjects of study & examination shall be English.

**8. Attendance:**

8.1 Each student is normally required to attend all the lectures & practical of every subject as also the curricular & co-curricular activities.

8.2 A student must have minimum 80% attendance in theory & 100% attendance in practical of each subject for appearing in examination.

**9. Organization of the Programme:**

9.1 The period 1<sup>st</sup> October to 30<sup>th</sup> September shall constitute one academic year.

9.2 There shall be minimum 37 weeks shall be devoted for academic activities, excluding 4 weeks for examination & their preparation.

9.3 The academic activities shall be carried for minimum 40 hours / week.

9.4 The course delivery in each academic year shall be carried out in accordance with minimum hours assigned to each subject & allied activities.

**10. Syllabus:**

The syllabus of the programme shall contain subject wise content details academic year wise as prescribed Indian Council of Nursing duly approved by Board of Study & Academic Council shall be published separately.

**11. Admission Procedure:**

- Admission in all the courses will be based on merit.
- A course wise merit list be called for counseling which eventually would lead to the admission.

**Instructions for conduction of examination**

1. Teaching of Anatomy, Physiology, Pharmacology and Pathology will be integrated with clinical subjects.
2. A minimum 80% attendance in theory and practical / Clinical in each subject is essential for appearing in the examination.
3. 100% attendance in practical / clinical in each clinical area is essential before award of degree.
4. 50% of minimum marks in each theory and practical paper separately is required for passing.
5. A candidate has to secure minimum of 33% in qualifying subject for passing.
