ORDINANCE / REGULATIONS FOR

B.A.LL.B.(Integrated) and BBA.LL.B(Integrated) Programmes

Under the Faculty of Law, Integral University, Lucknow

2019-2020

The University will run the B.A.LL.B.(Integrated) and BBA.LL.B(Integrated) Programmes under the Faculty of Law.

1. Admission

1.1 Admission to B.A.LL.B.(Integrated) and BBA.LL.B(Integrated) Programmes 1st semester will be made as per the rules prescribed by the Academic Council of Integral University, Lucknow.

2. Eligibility

2.1 The University will from time to time, stipulate the minimum percentage of marks of candidate as per Bar Council of India rules.

2.2 Provided that such minimum qualifying marks shall not automatically entitle a person to get admission unless the applicant fulfills other criteria notified by the University.

2.3 The minimum age for seeking admission into B.A.LL.B.(Integrated) and BBA.LL.B(Integrated) Programmes shall be decided by University on the recommendation of Bar Council of India.

3. Duration

3.1 B.A.LL.B.(Integrated) and BBA.LL.B(Integrated) Programmes will be of five years duration, each year comprising two semesters. Each semester shall have normally 90 (Ninety) working days, or as prescribed by the University from time to time.

3.2 The maximum time allowed for completing the B.A.LL.B.(Integrated) and BBA.LL.B(Integrated) Programmes shall be Eight (8) Years.

3.3 The candidate failing to complete the course within the maximum time prescribed in clause 3.2 shall be liable for cancellation of their admission. In such a case the candidate shall have no financial claim on the University.

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4. Registration

Each Student has to register in every semester of the programme.

5. Curriculum & Credit System

5.1 The Curriculum has been divided into Ten Semesters and shall include Lectures, Tutorials, Practical's, Seminars and Moot Court as defined in the scheme of instructions and examinations and executive instructions issued by the University from time to time.

5.2 **Minimum Credit Requirements:** The minimum credit required for award of B.A.LL.B.(Integrated) and BBA.LL.B(Integrated) Programmes is 236. This is normally divided into Theory Subjects, Practical Subjects, Seminars Presentation and Moot Courts, Para Legal Training in duration of Six Semesters. The credits are distributed Semester wise as given in the Evaluation Scheme of each Programme. Subjects generally progress in sequences, building competencies and their positioning indicates certain academic maturity on the part of the students. Students are expected to follow the semester wise schedule of subjects given in the Evaluation Scheme of the respective Programmes.

5.3 **Subject Categories:** The Curriculum will contain subjects in the following categories having credits in the ranges given below in such a way that the total of all credits will be equal to that required for the award of degree. The categories of subjects are:-

5.4 **The Curriculum Structure (Evaluation Scheme):** The Curriculum will contain a listing of all subjects, with each subject having a subject category, subject code, subject title, number of contact periods per week, number of credits assigned, and the marks assigned to various components of evaluation.

5.5 **Approval of the Curriculum:** The Curriculum for B.A.LL.B.(Integrated) and BBA.LL.B(Integrated) Programmes will be prepared by the department concerned and will be approved by the Board of Studies of the department. It will then be placed in the Faculty Board for Approval which consists of one External Expert and such Faculty Member nominated by the Dean Faculty of Law. Once approved by the Faculty Board, it will be placed in the Academic Council for final approval and then the Curriculum will be implemented. Same procedure shall be used for any modification in the Curriculum.

6. Examination / Assessment and Grading

6.1 Components of Evaluation: Each subject will be evaluated out of 100 marks. The subjects will normally have two components of evaluation.

- i) Continuous Assessment (CA)
- ii) End-Semester Examination (ESE)

Heads of Passing: Continuous Assessment (CA) and End Semester Examination (ESE) shall be two separate heads for passing a subject.

6.2 Promotion of Student and Award of Grades: A Student will be declared PASS if.

- He / She secure at least 50% marks in CA & 35% marks in ESE.

OR

- If he / she fails in Continuous Assessment but secures 50% or more in the total (Continuous Assessment + End Semester Examination) in that subject he / she will be declared as PASS.

6.3 Carry Forward of Marks: In case of a student who does not fulfill criteria mentioned in section 6.3 and fails in the Continuous Assessment and/or End Semester Examination in one or more subjects.

- A Student who PASSES in the continuous Assessment but FAILS in the End Semester Examination of the subject shall reappear for the End Semester Examination of that subject. However his/her marks of the Continuous Assessment shall be carried over and he / she shall be entitled for grade obtained by him/her on passing.

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- A Student who PASSES in the End Semester Examination but FAILS in the Continuous Assessment of the subject shall reappear for the Continuous Assessment of that subject. However his/her marks of the End Semester Examination shall be carried over and he/she shall be entitled for grade obtained by him/her on passing. If he / she fails in Continuous Assessment but secures 50% or more in the total (Continuous Assessment + End Semester Examination) in that subject he / she will be declared as PASS.

6.4 Re-examination of Continuous Assessment and End Semester Examination:-

6.5.(I). **Re-examination for Continuous Assessment** should be completed before the commencement of Next Semester Theory Examination.

Example: A Student who is supposed to reappear for Internal Assessment in Semester-I subject will appear for the Re-examination before commencement of End Semester Examination of Semester-II. Re-examination of Continuous Assessment will be based on single examination having same marks as of original assessment. A Student who is supposed to reappear for can be of the form of a subject project/assignment problems / test etc. A Student will do the submission of the assigned work in the predefined period. Records should be maintained properly for all the re-examination as well as Continuous Assessments.

6.5 (II). **Re-examination if End Semester Examination** will be conducted as per the schedule planned by the University.

6.5 **Allowed to Keep Term (ATKT):** For promotion from current year to subsequent year a student should not fail in more than the following heads: Note: Grade AB (Absent) should be considered as failed and treated as one head for deciding ATKT.

6.6 Grading of Performance

6.6.1 **Letter Grade and Grade Point Allocation:** In B.A.LL.B./BBA.LL.B.(Integrated) Programme based on the combined performance in all Assessments in a particular Semester as per the Curriculum/Syllabus the Student is awarded a letter grade. These letter grades not only indicate a qualitative Assessment of the learner's performance but also carry a quantitative (numeric) equivalent called the Grade Point. The Letter Grades and their Equivalent Grade Point.

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A learner who remains **absent** in any form of **evaluation/examination, letter grade** allocated to him/her should be **AB** and corresponding **grade point** is **zero**. He / she should reappear for the said evaluation / examination in due course. The subjects which has been adopted from others programmes their grades will be decided as per the ordinance of respective programme.

7. Re-admission in the University

A Student who fails and has not been promoted to the higher class will have to repeat the year as a regular student. He / She will be allowed for re-admission on payment of prescribed fees provided he/she satisfies one of the following conditions:

- 7.1 A Student is declared failed.
- 7.2 A Student did not appear in the semester examination and / or he / she was granted permission for not to appear in the examination on his/her own request.
- 7.3 A Student has been detained by the University and has also been permitted to take re-admission.
- 7.4 A Student promoted with carry over subjects and he / she opted for re-admission.

8. Result

- 8.1 If a student passes all the examinations and fulfills all the requirements for the award of degree his/her result will be shown as “Passed” mentioning letter grade obtained by the student.
- 8.2 Rank/Positions will be determined at the end of even semesters. Only those students who fulfill the following conditions will be eligible for ranks/positions:
 - I). They do not have any break in their studies;
 - II). They have passed every scheduled subject in first attempt;
 - III). They have passed every subject on time as per the curriculum;
 - IV). They have earned credits as per the schedule given in the curriculum;
 - V). They have not improved grade in any subject after passing the subject.

The students who violate any of the above conditions will not be awarded any rank/position. The ranks/positions will be determined on the basis of Cumulative Grade Performance Index (CGPI)

9. Grace Marks

9.1 A student may be awarded grace marks up to the maximum of total 10 marks, in maximum 4 subject including theory papers, practical, seminar, practical training and / or aggregate marks in each academic year provided he / she can be declared to have passed the academic year by the award of these marks.

9.2 The grace marks shall not be added to the aggregate marks.

10. Scrutiny

10.1 Scrutiny shall be allowed in only theory papers as per the rules of the University.

10.2 Re-evaluation is not permitted.

11. Award of Degree

On having successfully completed the programme, the student shall be awarded degree a B.A.LL.B.(Integrated) and BBA.LL.B(Integrated) Programme.

12. Cancellation of Admission

The admission of student at any stage of study shall be cancelled if:

I). He/She is not found qualified as per state government norms and guidelines or the eligibility criteria prescribed by the University.

or

II). He / She is found unable to complete the programme within the stipulated time as prescribed in clause 3.2.

or

III). He /She is found involved in creating indiscipline in the University.

or

IV). He/She is found involed in any criminal case / has given any false statement.

13.Attendance

13.1 The attendance of student shall be reckoned from the date of his/her registration in the class.

13.2 Each student is normally required to attend all the lectures, tutorials, moot court and internship.

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13.3 Each student is normally required to attend all the lectures, tutorials, moot court and legal aid camps. However, a minimum attendance of 70% will be necessary. The Dean of the concerned faculty may condone the absence on medical reasons, further up to a maximum 5%.

14. Internship

Each registered student shall have completed minimum of 20 (twenty) weeks internship during the entire period of legal studies under NGO, Trial and Appellate Advocates, Judiciary, Legal Regulatory Authorities Legislature and Parliament and Other such bodies as the universities shall stipulate where law is practiced either in action or in dispute resolution or in management.

Provided that internship in any year cannot be a continuous period of more than four weeks.

15. Keeping in view the future role of law graduate it shall be prerogative of Dean Faculty of Law to introduce uniform for students as and when deems fit.
