Faculty members of various department, research scholars, students, and alumni have actively participated in the program.

PDP Highlights

- Registered Participants: 83.
- Two sessions were organized per day.
- **62 hours** of online active engagement through content-based learning on Google meet.
- Participants were from different states across **India** and also from **Saudi Arabia** and **Germany**.
- A "Certificate of Completion" was given to all the successful participants.

The inaugural session was held on 08th November, 2021 which started with the welcome address delivered by **Prof. Abdul Rahman Khan,** Dean, Faculty of Science, HoD, Chemistry, Integral University, Lucknow. It was followed by a keynote lecture on the topic "Introduction of Intellectual Property Right (IPR): the rules and regulations correlated to the IPR" by **Prof. Tufail Ahmad Khan,** HoD of School of Law, Presidency University, and Bengaluru. **Prof. Tufail** addressed the attendees that included faculty members, research scholars, students, alumni, and other staff members. He shared his broad knowledge and expertise on the "Intellectual Property Right" (IPR). He explained multiple delusions associated with intellectual property and also familiarized us with the rules and regulations correlated to the IPR.
