A report on 2nd National Pharmacovigilance Week (From 17th - 23rd September, 2022)

The Theme of National Pharmacovigilance week was 'Encouraging Reporting of ADR by Patients'. During celebration, the various events were organized such as Walkathon, Nukkad Natak, Sensitizing sessions for patients, guest lectures for Health Care Professionals and quiz.

Celebration was initiated with walkathon with banners, placards, posters, verbal interactions with patients, at Integral Institute of Medical Science and Research (IIMS&R). The students of M. Pharm (Pharmacology), Pharm D. and MBBS with their teachers were involved.

One guest lecture on "Pharmacovigilance & Challenges in Indian Scenario" was also delivered by Prof. R.K. Dixit, Deportment of Pharmacology, KGMU on 19th September, 2022. Prof. Dixit deliberated the topic in very interesting way & covered all aspects of ADRs & challenges that are faced to report the ADRs & motivated the audience to a great extent.

On same day i.e. 19th September, a session was organized for sensitization of patients for ADR reporting in RHTC (Rural Health Training Centre) under Community Medicine Deportment. Dr. Deepak Chopra, Professor Deportment of Community Medicine and incharge RHTC, made all arrangements for patients & Dr. Q.S. Ahmed, Prof. & Head, Deportment of Pharmacology gave a sensitization talk for ADR reporting & motivated them.

Another session was organized on 20th September, 2022. A lecture was given by Professor Abha Chandra, Dean IIMS&R. Her topic was "Adverse Drug Reactions & Need of Pharmacovigilance". 

An online quiz on Pharmacovigilance was also organized for M. Pharm, MBBS & Pharm D. students & interns on 22nd September, 2022.





























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
