

Report on "Kisan Gosthi" in Bhakamau Village on "Women Empowerment through Livestock Enterprises in Rural Areas"

The Department of Agriculture at the Integral Institute of Agricultural Science & Technology (IIAST) organized a Kisan Goshthi on 4th May 2024, in Bhakamau Village, Tehsil BKT, District Lucknow. The primary focus of this event was to promote women empowerment through livestock enterprises, highlighting the significant role of livestock farming in improving the socio-economic status of women in rural areas. The program was conducted under the esteemed guidance of Prof. Mohd Haris Siddiqui and Prof. Saba Siddiqui, with the support of Dr. Deepti Srivastava, Dr. Pankaj Kumar Gupta, and Dr. Srishti Thakur.

The Kisan Goshthi organized by IIAST successfully highlighted the importance of livestock enterprises in empowering women in rural areas. By providing education, practical skills, and support through government schemes, the event aimed to enhance the socio-economic status of women farmers. Dr. Gupta also discussed the various types of livestock suitable for rural areas, such as dairy cattle, goats, poultry, and sheep. **Dr. Shrishti Thakur** focused on the broader impact of livestock enterprises on women's empowerment.
